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Latest Trends In Anti-Ageing Medicine

R Anushka Reddy, an experienced cosmetic physician in Johannesburg who also trains doctors, has recently returned from the World Anti-Ageing conference in Monte Carlo and shares

some of latest trends in anti-ageing medicine.
Trends reflect that more people are opting for nonsurgical procedures because of minimal healing
time, lower costs and major advances related to
these procedures. The latest to come out of the AntiAgeing World Conference are:

Stem cells will be used extensively in anti-ageing medicine. They are non-specific cells, and can generate healthy cells in ageing skin. With advances in stem cell research, scientists can take youthful adult cells and stimulate them until they release certain signals. These signal indicators are then collected in a cream base that would be applied to the hands, face and neck or any portion of the body. The procedure has already been clinically tested and evidence shows that it can intensify the moisturising of the skin and will eradicate any fine lines, wrinkles and ageing skin indications. The best explanation given by clinical scientists is that it is equal to turning a raisin back into a grape!

Nanotechnology is being heralded in some circles as the answer to a range of anti-ageing problems, as evidenced by the world's largest cosmetics company devoting most of their research budget to nanotechnology. The technology uses nanosomes to push anti-ageing ingredients deep into the dermis. Nanotechnology also extends the range of ingredients that can be used in cosmetics. Many highly active anti-ageing ingredients which would cause skin irritation in their raw state are coated with nanosomes and can be delivered to the underlying layers of the skin without causing inflammation.

Building on the demand of minimally-invasive procedures, 'EyeJuvenation' will become a popular offering. Coupled with the FDA approval of Latisse, which supports the growth of fuller, darker eyelashes, practitioners will offer a suite of services and products focusing specifically on the eye. This includes Botox for treatment of crows feet and deep wrinkles between the brows, coupled with the use of dermal fillers such as Restylane to fill deeper hollows below and around the eyes.
